

<u>Guidance for Organisations when Hosting HM Vice Lord-Lieutenant of</u> Cambridgeshire

- 1. The Vice Lord-Lieutenant, **Brigadier Tim Seal TD ADC DL VR**, will be attending your event.
- 2. The Vice Lord-Lieutenant is The King's representative and should therefore take precedence over all your other guests.
- 3. It is expected that the Vice Lord-Lieutenant will be met on arrival, where they can then be informed of the programme and what is required of them.
- 4. They should be escorted throughout the duration of their stay with you.
- 5. If the Vice Lord-Lieutenant is required to give a speech, prior notice must be given well in advance of the event.
- 6. For formal Church Services. It is normally expected that the Vice Lord-Lieutenant will be the **last** to take their seat in the church and the **first** to leave after the Standards and clergy.

The correct form of address for the Vice Lord-Lieutenant is:

- Introducing/announcing at an event etc: His Majesty's Vice Lord-Lieutenant of Cambridgeshire, Brigadier Tim Seal TD ADC DL VR
- Written: Brigadier Tim Seal TD ADC DL VR, HM Vice Lord-Lieutenant of Cambridgeshire
- Salutation: Dear Vice Lord-Lieutenant or Brigadier Seal
- In a speech preamble: Vice Lord-Lieutenant, Ladies and Gentlemen ...
- Conversation: Initially as Vice Lord-Lieutenant and thereafter as Brigadier Seal/Sir
